Citizens can create household profiles to provide critical information for use by first responders in the event of an emergency. SafeTown also lets law enforcement, fire and emergency services agencies post alerts to the community such as traffic accidents, criminal activity or local weather information. The purpose of these meetings is to continue enhancing the two-way communication between residents, police officers, city agencies and area businesses.

Contractor crews will be out for another week. The asphalt plant will open early to be able to provide hot mix. • Rebuild Indy – From 2010-2013 about \$500 million in infrastructure improvements were made throughout Marion County through the RebuildIndy program. • If RebuildIndy 2 is passed, it will fund up to \$350 million in projects over three years. • Great Indy Clean-Up – 375 volunteers have signed up for the April 26 event.

<p>Better Block, Garfield Park Neighbors <i>Jim Simmons</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Garfield Park neighbors and Big Car worked together to create the Better Block event last October. The event was designed to create a future vision for a commercial area on Shelby Street. The day, from 11:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., included vendors, local foods, beer, artists, live music and activities for families. Better Block committees included: budget, property owner engagement, pop-up engagement, donations, volunteers, entertainment and promotion. • Better Block II will be held June 28, starting at Southern and Shelby. • Garfield Park Neighbors filed for incorporation which enables them to fund raise. • They also worked with the IUPUI Solution Center which assists business, industry, government, and nonprofit organizations in accessing the appropriate resources to meet their challenges and reach their goals. A team from the center put together a strategic plan for the neighborhood.

The event, to be held at the Fountain Square Brewery, 1301 Barth Avenue, will also give an opportunity to bid on silent auction items and to vote on artwork. ○ The Special Projects Committee, working with SEND and the Arts Council, is in the final stages of getting the Power2Give online fundraising tool set up to raise money for artists' stipends.
